The building is now up, but still requires lots of work. A group is going to be set up with members from the Youth Club, STC. Lions. Rotary – this is to be set up by the Youth Club

Clir V Benjamin-Smith reported that she has attended New Councillor Training online – very interesting and lots of information shared between attendees

CIIr J Williams reported that Lloyds Bank closes tomorrow. Is still chasing this subject up, as the independent assessor is in fact not independent from LINK – will be following this up with the FCA to get this looked into.

Clir P Tesh reported that he attended the Town Meeting at the Townsend Hall regarding the Fell Mill potential housing development. Also attended the Remembrance Sunday Parade. Has had 2 meetings today, instigated by SDC Clir O Hatch – first one regarding the Fell Mill scoping application and timescales, with Planning Officers from SDC and the second with Severn Trent regarding all the housing development applications – expressing concern over the capacity on the treatment works and flooding events as well as water supply. They will be investigating this. Has also received 4 interested parties to help with the Neighbourhood Plan Development.

Clir H Kelly attended a conference in Leamington on the Local Climate Engagement Plan, which was absolutely brilliant. Also accepted an invitation from Orbit to see the refurbishment of Rainbow Fields – was very disappointed that they have done nothing to help residents reduce their energy and water consumption. A Local resident has also complained about the parking from the Sports Club Fireworks Display, referred to WCC highways. Also attended a 2 hour zoom call on Sustainability and mitigation for climate change for Town Councils

Clir I Cooper asked that the Council send condolences to ex Councillor Ronnie Murphy after the passing of her partner. Thought that both Friday evening's Mayor's event was brilliant and Remembrance Parade was brilliant and very well attended – the quality of the wreaths were not as good quality this year, so maybe something to think about next year. **Clir R Walters** echoed Councillors comments regarding the Mayor's Event and Remembrance Sunday – both were brilliant.

13.3 District Council Reports (SDC – Stratford District Council)

SDC CIIr D Passingham attended both meetings with CIIr P Tesh today – both useful meetings. Has also been trying to get improvements to the Darlingscote Road/Campden Road junction, has agreement from the minor works department from WCC to have some of the Highway Community Action Fund – being discussed during STC's finance working group. Has asked for some of the S106 money left from the developments from the Campden Road – had no response yet.

13.4 County Council Reports (WCC – Warwickshire County Council)

WCC Clir J Barker reported that Highways now have a new head who seems unbelievably good – has attended meetings he has asked to attend and has more of an understanding of what County should be doing. Seems to have a much better handle on how things should be done. With regards to footways – he seems prepared to tackle companies for works not being completed properly, has already fined companies for not completing works on time etc.

Attended the Mayor's Civic Dinner on Friday and Remembrance Sunday – both were great.

Attended the Public meeting regarding the Fell Mill Lane Site – commented that this is the first time local parishes are working together well for common cause.

Medical Centre will be going in, physio is running as are hearing tests. Work is being carried out on the Princess Diana building and this will be used for further medical provision. It was also mentioned that it could be a possibility for the Citizens Advice to move from New Clark House to the Ellen Badger – Cllr Booth was looking into this.
